PWF Researcher Documents First-Ever Humpback Whale Copulation

On January 19, 2022, off the coast of Maui, Hawai'i, an unprecedented event was recorded for the first time — two humpback whales copulating. While this observation is remarkable on its own, this story has a remarkable twist — the encounter involved two male whales.



Humpback whales have long been subjects of fascination for researchers due to their intricate social behaviors, many of which are thought to relate to reproduction. Despite being extensively studied for decades, the sexual behavior of humpback whales has remained mostly a mystery, even for whale experts. However, a Pacific Whale Foundation researcher recently unveiled a historic finding—the first-ever documented copulation in humpback whales!

In Oslo, construction projects are now clean and quiet

In Norway's capital, building projects are no longer the noisy, polluting affairs they once were thanks to a pioneering zero-emission construction policy.

As of January 2025, all contractors providing work to Oslo's government have to use clean and quiet concrete trucks, excavators, and other machinery. The industry has had plenty of time to prepare for the shift: From 2019, the use of emission-free equipment wasn't mandatory, but did give firms an edge over their competitors when bidding for work, as did the use of recycled or low-carbon materials.

In 2023, 77% of city-managed projects used zero-emission machinery, according to Oslo's climate agency.

The policy hasn't materially driven up construction costs, according to green procurement official Geir Rossebø. That's because the total cost of owning and operating electric equipment is competitive — even if upfront costs remain higher for the time being.

On a trip to Gorongosa National Park in central Mozambique, photographer Charlie Hamilton James was particularly keen to capture the park's lions (*Panthera leo*) on the extensive floodplain that appears after the seasonal rains—"a feature," he says, "that makes the park so special."

The floodplain attracts birds such as storks and great white pelicans (*Pelecanus onocrotalus*), which move through the water in coordinated V-formations as they herd fish into the shallows. Although lions are mostly nocturnal hunters, Hamilton James caught one lioness repeatedly charging at the pelicans by day. "It was a pretty unique scene, and one I have never witnessed in years working with lions," he says. (The birds easily avoided her.)

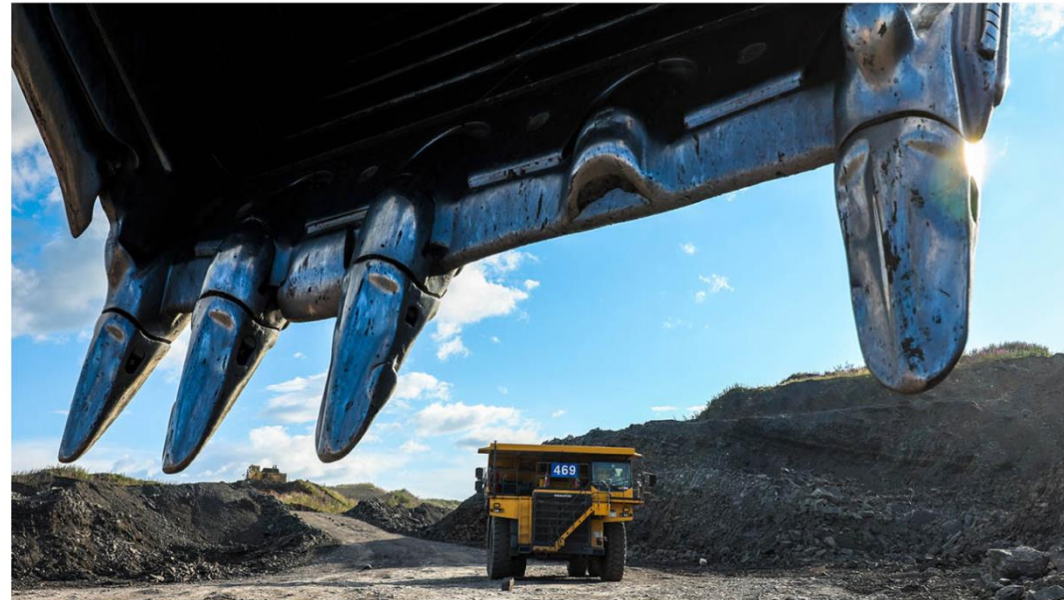

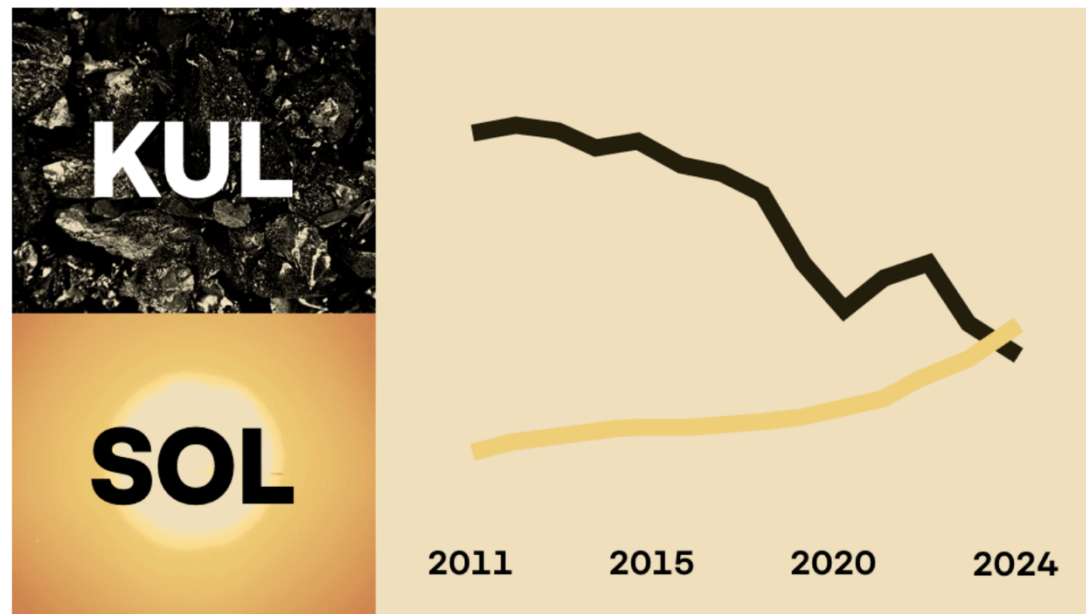

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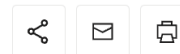

LONDON (October 1, 2024)– Today, the United Kingdom has officially closed its last coal-fired power plant, marking the end of coal use to generate electricity in the country. This closure comes a year earlier than initially anticipated. The UK had already dramatically reduced coal's share of the power mix, from 39% in 2012 to just 2% in 2020.

The UK is among several countries that have rapidly reduced coal use in recent years, according to [WRI analysis](#). Its pace of coal phase-out closely mirrors the reductions needed globally to keep the world aligned with 1.5 degrees of warming. It is estimated that the world will need to scale down coal power from 35.5% of electricity generation in 2023 to 4% by 2030.

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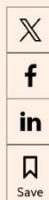

WASHINGTON, D.C. — As the Trump administration [announced](#) it will withdraw the U.S. from the Paris Agreement, the co-chairs of the U.S. Climate Alliance — New York Governor Kathy Hochul and New Mexico Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham — today [delivered a letter](#) to UN Climate Change Executive Secretary Simon Stiell making it clear to the global community that climate action will continue in the U.S.

Chart: 96 percent of new US power capacity was carbon-free in 2024

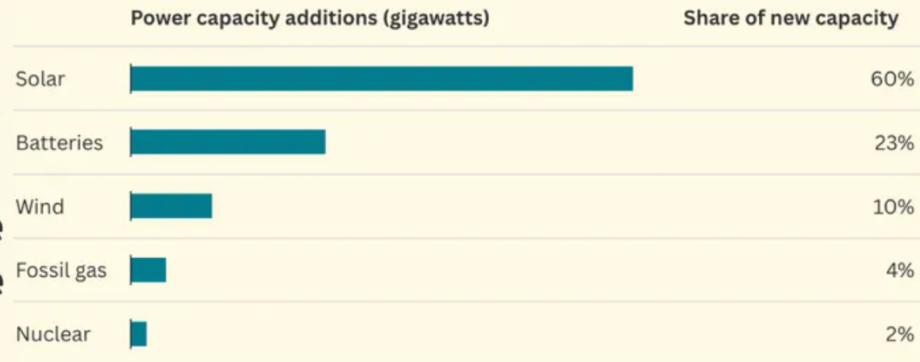

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LONDON, Nov 7 (Reuters) - Global solar capacity has reached a record 2 terawatts (TW) of capacity, with more added in the last two years than the previous 68 combined, exclusive data from the sector's global industry group shared with Reuters showed.

The updated figures have not previously been published, and the Global Solar Council said they give the fullest picture yet because they include small, rooftop installations often left out of official government data.

After the 2 TW milestone was breached this quarter, global solar capacity has become enough to power around 92 million U.S. households, the council said.

"Governments often don't have the full picture in terms of solar because they're often missing a lot of the small rooftop projects because they just never get registered anywhere in a lot of countries," Sonia Dunlop, CEO of the Global Solar Council, told Reuters in an interview.

The challenge now, she said, was to achieve 8 TW of installed solar power in total by 2030, which the data suggests is possible and would amount to more than half of the 11 TW of renewable capacity needed to

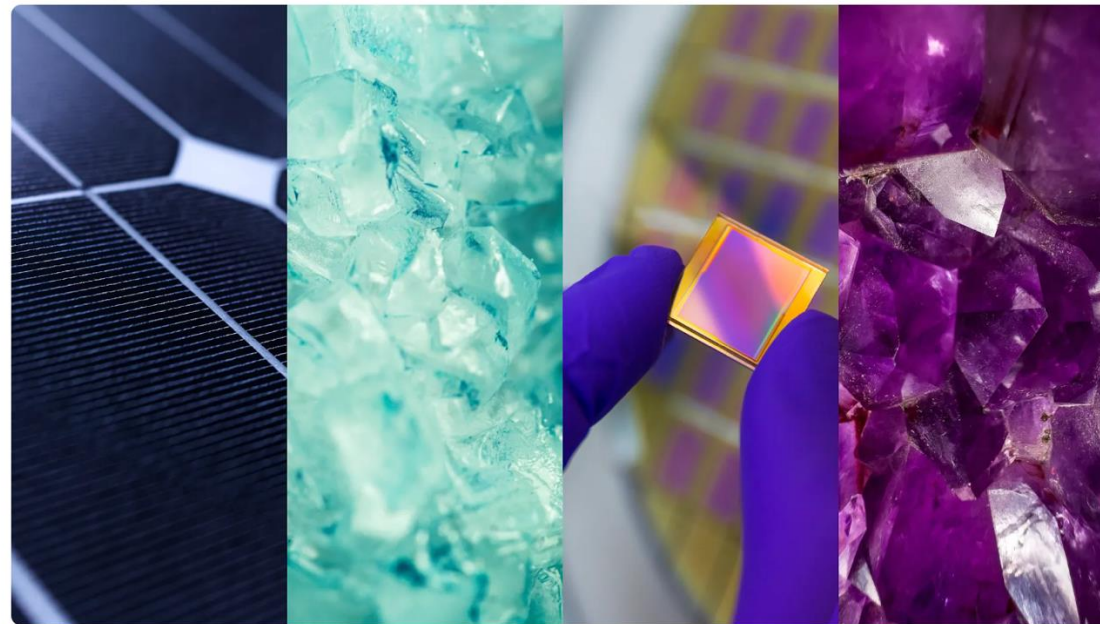

Where is water in the body

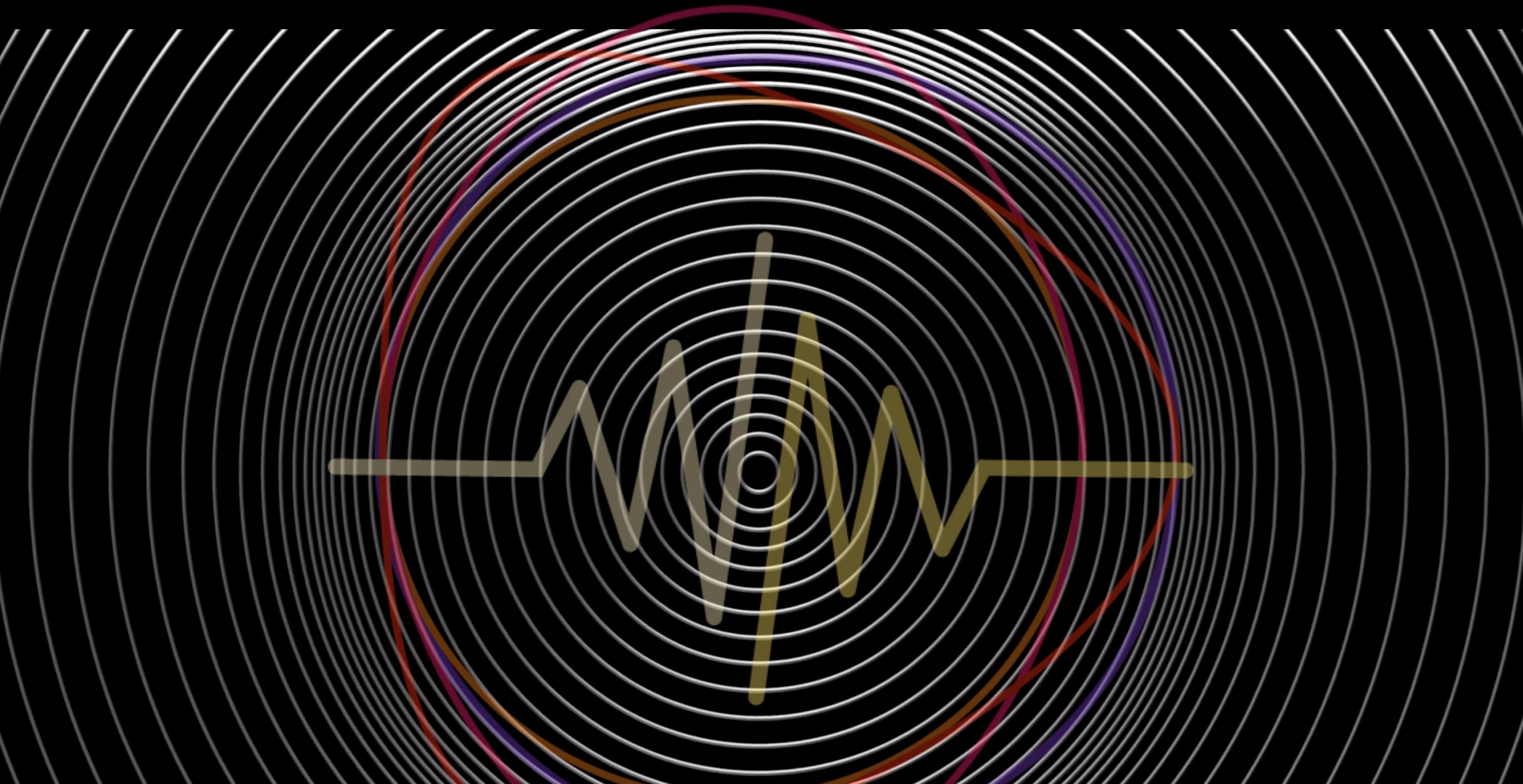
Water exists throughout the body. Cells contain [60%](#) of all water in the body, with roughly [one-third](#) of the remainder, surrounding the cells.

Some organs contain much more water than others. The brain and kidneys possess the highest percentage of water; the bones and teeth contain the lowest proportion.

The chart below gives the [highest to the lowest percentages](#) of water:

Body part	Water percentage
Brain	80–85%
Kidneys	80–85%
Heart	75–80%
Lungs	75–80%
Muscles	70–75%
Liver	70–75%
Skin	70–75%
Blood	50%
Bones	20–25%
Teeth	8–10%

Regardless of water content, all parts of the body need water to work properly.



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
